## **Unique Challenges:**

Like many projects, this one was complex, but by establishing relationships early and gaining trust, we created a solid working foundation. Some of the features we were able to achieve would not have happened unless we were involved early in the process.

## **Creative Solutions:**

An entryway creates a mood or vibe about a property and the people who live there. But it does not stand alone. Proper design demands that it be in harmony with the rest of the property. After an initial project consultation with the homeowner, we used the latest in technology, including multimedia design tools. It was clear that the property required something more than a typical horseshoe-shaped driveway. This property called for a courtyard-like entranceway to complement

the landscape and create a strong focal point for the home.” We suggested a parking port for multiple cars, which is very convenient. We even had enough room to put in a small sitting bench. From the port, you can walk right up the steps to the front door—an ideal use of space.

## **Quality Results:**

Success sprung from choosing the right materials for the job. We had multiple options for the project, but we needed to consider all the variables for those materials, including durability, ease of installation, aesthetics, etc. In the end, interlocking pavers gave us the ability to introduce color, texture and pattern into our design. The final project component was the captivating lighting on the new entranceway. Illuminating any home accentuates a vibrant landscape and displays the investment 24 hours a day. We want to add lighting that matched the existing light on the front door and the ability to use dimmers.
